
THE OPPORTUNITY

The University of South Dakota (USD) is pleased to invite nominations and applications for the position of **Dean of the School of Health Sciences**. Reporting to Tim Ridgway, MD, Vice President for Health Affairs and Dean of the Sanford School of Medicine, the Dean of the School of Health Sciences is responsible for providing administrative leadership for the academic, research, and public service missions of the school. The School of Health Sciences incorporates many of the most popular and fastest growing programs at USD at the baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral levels. Additionally, the School of Health Sciences is home to the Interprofessional Health Education Center, the Center for the Prevention of Child Maltreatment, and the South Dakota Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Program.

Within the past few years, the School of Health Sciences has opened in Vermillion a three-story, 45,000 square-foot Center for Health Education offering modern classrooms, innovative technology, simulation centers, a new community dental hygiene clinic and more. Importantly, the School of Health Sciences functions actively in interprofessional and multidisciplinary health education at the University of South Dakota campus in Vermillion, the USD campus in Sioux Falls, and the USD Sanford School of Medicine.

The School of Health Sciences mission statement emphasizes quality learner centered education in the health and human services professions. Students have exceeded the national average of their board certification exams, and low student-to-faculty ratio clinical experiences have prepared students for employment in their chosen field.









University of South Dakota – An Introduction

Students prepare for future challenges by completing rigorous curricula firmly grounded in high quality interprofessional education (IPE), which fosters whole body wellness utilizing an inclusive heath care team. Faculty members develop and implement activities across professions by contributing to four collaborating domains—curricular, community service, scholarship and health care simulation—each of which captures an IPE component. School of Health Sciences' students exhibit professional, community-focused and client-centered behavior, becoming alumni who are leaders, mentors, practitioners and change agents.

The School of Health Sciences has gifted, professional faculty who provide a wide range of health and human service programs for both undergraduate and graduate students. Professors are engaged educators






Our Philosophy

Departments and Programs

Department of Addiction Counseling and Prevention

The School of Health Sciences has been a leader in addiction counseling and prevention for approximately 50 years. Graduates consistently exceed the national average on board certification exams. Program experiences include inpatient and outpatient care facilities, detoxification, recovery, transitional and community and school prevention programs. A graduate degree (M.A.) and a graduate certificate are offered in Addiction Counseling & Prevention.

Department of Dental Hygiene

As the state's only dental hygiene program, students are prepared for state-of-the-art health practice, having completed an outreach-based, prevention-focused, patient-centered, interprofessional educational foundation that focuses on whole body wellness. Students are prepared for the national dental hygiene board exam, which is required for licensure in any state. School of Health Sciences' students have had a 100% passage on this national exam since 2005.



Department of Public Health & Health Sciences

Offers real world experience through service learning and hands-on practice. In the B.S. in Health Sciences program, students gain a strong foundation in health care, including knowledge of a variety of health care fields and development of skills that are essential for quality patient care. The Master of Public Health (MPH) is offered online in partnership with South Dakota State University. This program uses an interprofessional approach to address the five core areas of public health: biostatistics, epidemiology, health services administration, social and behavioral sciences and environmental health. The Doctor of Philosophy in Health Sciences (Ph.D.) is designed to prepare practicing health care professionals to assume leadership roles in academia, research and/or health and human services practice settings.

Department of Medical Laboratory Science

This program offers the latest technology to diagnose and treat disease through a variety of laboratory tests. School of Health Sciences' students have had a 100% passage rate on the National Board Certification Exam since 2008. The department has educated students since its founding in 1947.






Department of Nursing

USD's nursing department is the only program in the state that trains future nurses together with 10 health science disciplines and a medical school. Its students experience learning in teams made up of physicians, nurses and other health practitioners, an experience that has become increasingly important as nursing continues to expand and evolve. Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) students have surpassed both the national and South Dakota National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) averages for passing the NCLEX exam on the first attempt. The BSN degree is offered in Vermillion and Sioux Falls. In addition to the BSN, graduate nursing degrees are offered in:

- Nurse Anesthesia Practice (DNAP)
- Nursing Practice-Nursing Informatics and e-Health (MSN)
- Nursing Practice-Organizational and System Leadership (DNP)





Department of Occupational Therapy

Students are provided with a holistic perspective that considers the physical, psychological and social needs of their clients and to understand the importance of adapting the environment to fit the person. The Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) degree is designed to prepare students to be occupational therapists with exceptional expertise, support research and create innovative services for communities and cultures in South Dakota.

Department of Physical Therapy


The program offers faculty experts and small class sizes. Over the past few years, nearly 100% of students passed the National Physical Therapy Examination on their first attempt. Students have presented research at national conferences, assisted physical therapy faculty in treating Division I athletes, participated in one of 200-plus clinical education sites around the world, received personalized academic and career assistance from a core faculty adviser and learned from board-certified clinical specialists in sports, orthopedics, geriatrics and neurology. A graduate degree is offered in Physical Therapy (DPT).

Department of Physician Assistant Studies

As the only physician assistant program in South Dakota, the USD Department of Physician Assistant Studies (M.S.) takes place in two areas—didactic and clinical—and emphasizes rural health care. The program also boasts a strong hands-on anatomy lab and robust clinical rotation network, as well as collaboration across health professions.

Department of Social Work

USD is the only public university in the state to offer both bachelor's and master's degrees in social work. The full-time program allows students to become licensed clinical social workers. Undergraduate and graduate degrees are accredited by the Council on Social Work Education.






Centers and Institutes

Center for the Prevention of Child Maltreatment

The center focuses on delivering education, outreach and research geared toward eliminating child sexual abuse and maltreatment throughout the state of South Dakota. The center trains mandatory reporters, helps victims and their families navigate the criminal justice system and provides data analysis to state agencies.

Interprofessional Health Education Center

The center facilitates collaborative learning among students within the School of Health Sciences and the Sanford School of Medicine. Interprofessional education provides opportunities for students studying different health care professions to learn from and with each other. It trains health care professionals to work as a team and to help them develop an awareness of each other's roles and responsibilities.







Facilities

In 2022, the School of Health Sciences moved into a new, state-of-the-art facility in Vermillion. The three-story, 45,000 square-foot Center for Health Education offers modern classrooms, innovative technology, simulation centers, a new community dental hygiene clinic and more.



USD Leadership



Sheila Gestring President

Sheila Gestring became the 18th President of the University of South Dakota in 2018. She is a native South Dakotan and earned her Master of Business Administration degree from USD in 2014. She is the second woman and alumna to serve as president. Prior to becoming president, she served as chief financial officer on the USD finance staff. As a financial leader for USD, Gestring stabilized the university's financial position and developed innovative financing plans for new facilities. She also has been leader of the Onward—the Campaign for South Dakota capital campaign, which raised over \$250 million.



Tim RidgwayVice President for Health Affairs and Dean, Sanford School of Medicine

Dr. Tim Ridgway is the 15th dean of the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine and the vice president for Health Affairs. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Augustana University and Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of South Dakota School of Medicine. After completing a transitional residency at McKennan Hospital in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, he completed his internal medicine residency and gastroenterology fellowship at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in Rochester, Minnesota. Dr. Ridgway is a Fellow of the American Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy and a Master of the American College of Physicians. He has been a faculty member of the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine since 1997.



Kurt HackemerVice President for Academic Affairs and Provost

Kurt Hackemer, Ph.D., came to USD in 1996 and served previously as associate dean of the College of Arts & Sciences, associate vice president for Academic Affairs, as well as interim registrar, interim diversity officer, and interim vice president for Academic Affairs and provost. In addition, Hackemer served as chair of the Department of History and coordinator of the Native American Studies program from 2014 to 2018, and interim dean of the College of Arts & Sciences in 2017. He received his bachelor's degree in history at the University of Chicago, and master's and doctoral degrees from Texas A&M University.



The Position

Reporting to Tim Ridgway, M.D., vice president for Health Affairs and dean of the Sanford School of Medicine, the dean of the School of Health Sciences will be responsible for the administrative leadership and oversight of the School of Health Sciences.

This position will be expected to focus on interprofessional and multidisciplinary health education concurrently at the University of South Dakota campus in Vermillion, the USD campus in Sioux Falls and the USD Sanford School of Medicine. The new dean also will be expected to champion the School of Health Sciences and work with the vice president for Health Affairs and others to present a unified force in health education and workforce development for South Dakota.



Moreover, the dean will advance the educational, research and public service missions; manage its fiscal and human resources; promote excellence among faculty, staff and students; and lay a vital role in fundraising and alumni relations. The dean also will promote and negotiate health care education to clinical and affiliated entities, as well as to community/state professionals and leaders, and will explore growth opportunities and manage budget and resource allocation. Importantly, the dean, in conjunction with faculty colleagues, will build and monitor strategic vision, guide academics and research, and, in all, will provide operational leadership to all aspects of the School of Health Sciences.

Finally, the dean works in strong collaboration with colleague deans across the University of South Dakota and provides leadership for myriad clinical affiliates throughout the state and region.

Strategic Priorities

Over the coming years, the dean of the School of Health Sciences will address the following Strategic Priorities:

- Articulating a vision and guiding development of the Strategic Plan

 It will be vital for the next dean to oversee the evolving strategic planning process to ensure that the School of Health Sciences continues to be an innovative leader in its programs and supports the University's overall strategic
 - priorities. The dean must make certain that these efforts are transparent and, in the process, engage the faculty, staff, and students broadly in the new School of Health Sciences strategic plan to be developed during the 2026-27 academic year.
- Building key external, interprofessional, and interdisciplinary partnerships
 - The University of South Dakota offers a strong and dynamic foundation to promote partnerships of all kinds. The next dean will be a vital partner in communicating and promoting those efforts—internally and externally, particularly with tis statewide health partners Sanford Health, Avera Health, Monument Health, Independent Health Solutions, and others. These efforts will be central to providing School of Health Sciences students with exceptional clinical and educational experiences both on- and off-campus.



Strengthening accreditation

As the School of Health Sciences builds on its strong record in accreditation, it is expected that the accreditation review of the D.N.A.P. will occur during the 2026-27 academic year. Additionally, the Ph.D. in Health Sciences will undergo a program review the same year. Three more accreditation reviews are anticipated in 2027-28.

Enhancing research

Encouraging a culture of scholarship, which will bring opportunities for external funding, will enhance the School of Health Profession's strengths. By making strategic hires who will bring with them the culture of discovery, the dean can play a key role in expanding the research enterprise for faculty and students alike.

· Expanding philanthropic giving

The next dean will play a key role in expanding and enhancing external support for the school. The need for fundraising will become an ever-increasing responsibility for the dean—exploring new relationships and nurturing past connections.

• Ensuring the continuing fiscal health of the School of Health Sciences

In an ever-changing environment for higher education, it will be necessary for the dean to continue to ensure fiscal stability for the school. The dean must be skilled at mission-driven, and data supported decision making, practical budget management, and prioritizing key needs and available resources effectively.

• Enhancing the unique shared relationship between the School of Health Sciences and the USD Sanford School of Medicine

Although the dean will be headquartered on the USD campus in Vermillion, there is a strong interprofessional relationship throughout its academic programs with the USD School of Medicine in Sioux Falls and throughout the state. The dean will be expected to spend quality time on all campuses, as well as with its partner clinics throughout the state of South Dakota. Additionally, plans are currently underway to move the medical school to a new location in Sioux Falls.

· Continuing to build a School of distinction

While the strength of the current faculty is evident, new and evolving programs will offer occasion for continued enhancement. The dean will seize opportunities to find the brightest and best to join the School of Health Sciences. Moreover, the dean will want to find ways to connect with the School of Health Sciences faculty, staff, and students on a regular basis. That level of communication and understanding is vital for the school's continuing growth in quality.

Continuing to meet the needs of its students—undergraduate and graduate

In the constantly evolving world of healthcare and human services, the School of Health Sciences will continue to be at the forefront of educational innovation to allow its graduates to become fully prepared to future the needs of its clientele, as well as in the creation of new knowledge to benefit the profession at large.

- Demonstrated administrative leadership within an academic or similarly complex institution

Preferred Qualifications

- Clinical experience within a rural health care or human services environment
- Evidence of a record of guiding, mentoring, and directing program chairs and faculty to support institutional and program missions
- Experience interacting and promoting health care education to community professionals and leaders
- Demonstrated effectiveness as a spokesperson for the School and University
- Evidence of participation in development, alumni relations, and philanthropic activities
- A strong record of providing a positive, supportive role for students, faculty, and staff, modeling exemplary ethical and professional behavior
- Experience in fostering a high-performing, collaborative team to advance interdisciplinarity, delegate authority, and ensure accountability



Preferred Traits

- Ability to develop and communicate a long-term strategy and vision
- Ability to identify and respond to changing circumstances in health care professions
- Ability to articulate a unified vision and mission for the School of Health Sciences
- Ability to establish strong connections and clear communication with Sanford School of Medicine
- Ability to possess the financial experience and acumen to operate programs on a cost-effective and sustainable basis
- Ability to work within accreditation caps on student/faculty ratios and enrollment caps
